A policy toolkit : what for ?

→ International and European context: an increased concern for the state of marine ecosystems and a movement to reduce plastic production & waste

 \rightarrow Use the project's results and transform them into guidelines for local & regional governments or organisations, so they can directly apply them

 \rightarrow All partners of the project we involved

Capitalisation role the CPMR played
→ Expert of maritime policies with a strong network

→ CleanAtlantic is a way to promote the Atlantic practices to tackle marine litter at a large scale, and is complementary to our work for the AAC

i. Assessment, monitoring and databases on marine litter

What the partners did: Marine Litter viewer, use of ROVs (Remote Operated Vehicles), sampling campaigns, MOHID Lagrangian tool (tracer model)

What can local actors do with those tools?

→ Detect and identify types of marine litter and improve waste collection

→ Create databases about marine litter

→ Set up ambitious policies to ban some substances and fight against ilegal dumping





i. Assessment, monitoring and databases on marine litter

The **Welsh government** is working on a bill which will make an offence for a person to supply or offer to supply certain commonly littered and unnecessary single-used plastic products and will enable Welsh minister to add or remove a product from the list of cited wastes. In the region **Nouvelle Aquitaine**, the Trait Bleu programme enables the installation of tidal bins on the coastlines used to increase litter monitoring and optimize collect of marine litter.







ii. Marine litter removal and prevention

What the partners did: guidance for beach clean-ups, collaborations with coastguards and the fishing sector to retrieve marine litter

What can local actors do with those tools?

 \rightarrow Boost citizens' engagement and mobilize local stakeholders

→ Develop low-cost and environmental-friendly retrieval solutions

→ Promote adapted legislation to reduce the amount of marine litter





ii. Marine litter removal and prevention

The Regional Government of Galicia developed the "Plan Marlimpo" to protect biodiversity and marine ecosystems. The plan is implemented since 2020 by launching annual calls for EMFF funded projects to be developed by fishing guilds and fishermen organizations that carry out "Fishing for Litter" and awareness raising actions in the frame of those projects.

Created by Norte Region (CCDR-NORTE) early 2022 following the creation of the **CPMR Atlantic Arc Commission Working** Group on Ocean Pollution, the Regional Group of Experts is an informal network of entities, both public and private, carrying out different activities on issues related to the marine environment such as the prevention and control of ocean pollution, the management of marine litter and the fight against microplastic contaminants, among others.







iii. Marine litter reports and studies

What the partners did: analyse the impact of cigarette butts on the marine environment, análisis on the impacts of microliter on ecosystems, review the economic impact of marine litter

What can local actors do with those tools?

 \rightarrow Support initiatives to ban on certain ítems or to ensure a ciruclar economy

- → Awareness campaigns
- \rightarrow Support change consumption
- → Design tax on plastic and include economic stakeholders from the industry sector







iii. Marine litter reports and studies

In the face of growing microbeads pollution on the beaches, **Brittany** and **Pays de la Loire** regions announced filing a legal complaint in the name of the region early 2023. Brittany proposed technical support to fight against this type of pollution. As cigarette butts are the most found items on the beach, **Spanish autonomous regions** such as the **Pais Vasco, Galicia, Asturias** or **Andalusia** have banned smoking on their beaches as part of the <u>Playas Sin Humo</u> campaign.







iv. Educational tools

What the partners did: create a knowledge tool that compiles resources related to marine litter, creation of games or interactive stands for schools

What can local actors do with those tools?
 → Raise a new generation that is aware of the marine litter impacts

→ Develop youth environmental engagement







Asturias region developed COGERSA, a network of around 200 schools for recycling. It offers a space for training, environmental awareness, and exchange of educational experiences on good waste management.

As part of regional educational pact on "actors in the ecological and energy transition", **Pays de la Loire** proposed a special focus on the sea and coastline with the discovery of marine energy, coastal biodiversity, and waste at sea starting in 2018-9 school year.
