

Associated partners in the EU and in other countries, e.g. Canada, Switzerland













3rd Call absorption of decommitted ERDF




Currently working in the projects' closing: all activities must be finished before 31st July 2023

ightarrow Assess the impact and contribution of the Programme to the development of its target territories

Milestones and targets established (following the CPR) for each indicator as:

- Realistic, feasible, and appropriate to transmit crucial information on the evolution of objectives
- **Coherent** with the nature and character of each specific objective
- Transparent, with identified source data publicly available whenever possible
- Verifiable without demanding a disproportionate administrative burden

The Interreg Atlantic Area (AA): Programme within the framework of the European Union (EU) cohesion policy, contributing to economic, social and territorial cohesion.

Supports transnational cooperation projects in **22 Atlantic regions from 4 countries:** Spain, France, Ireland, Portugal.

Objective: to implement solutions to regional challenges in the fields of innovation, resource efficiency, environment and cultural assets, supporting regional development and sustainable growth.


The Programme is therefore aligned with the **Blue Growth Strategy** and the **Atlantic Martime Strategy**

The Atlantic Maritime Strategy and the future Atlantic Area **support each other** to achieve common objectives and stronger results for the benefit of Atlantic citizens




INTERREG ATLANTIC AREA 2021-2027





The Atlantic Area covers the western part of the Atlantic Ocean and includes regions from 4 countries, Spain France Ireland and Portugal. The total list of NUTS2 regions included in the Programme is as follows:

- France: Bretagne; Normandie; Nouvelle-Aquitaine;
 Pays de la Loire;
- Ireland: Northern and Western; Southern; Eastern and Midland;
- Portugal: Norte; Algarve; Centro; Lisboa; Alentejo;
 Açores; Madeira.
- Spain : Galicia; Principado de Asturias; Cantabria;
 Navarra; País Vasco; La Rioja; Andalucia; Islas
 Canarias.






ERDF by priority

- ✓ **45%** of the Programme budget allocated to thematic priorities;
- ✓ All projects are expected to **contribute to innovative solutions**;
- ✓ Through their activities, reach the objectives of the Programme;
- ✓ The approaches can be new, even experimental, since the Programme is particularly suited for testing new methods in a transnational network.

<u>Transnational cooperation</u> not only by bringing together partners from the 4 MS <u>BUT</u> also to work on a shared challenge and achieve innovative solutions that can be applied to the 4 of them, also regionally or locally.



- ✓ Projects financed by the AA Programme must demonstrate high transnational cooperation intensity throughout their lifetime with a clear focus on results.
- ✓ Partners must <u>work together</u> to deliver, disseminate and roll-out the results of their project.
- ✓ Partnerships involving a high diversity of actors covering the <u>quadruple</u> <u>helix approach</u>, including the relevant social and civil society actors, to achieve better linkages between public, private and research actors.
- ✓ The development of these joint solutions requires <u>enthusiasm and</u> commitment during project development and implementation.



The Call was open from the 14th October to the 3rd March.

- ✓ Application submitted: 62 → Being eligible 58
- ✓ Amounting:

Total cost: **163.692.566,08€**

ERDF: **122.769.420,19€**

Results should be communicated to candidates within 6-8 months after submission.



HOW PROJECTS WILL BE SELECTED

- ✓ All projects will be assessed by the Joint Secretariat (JS) with the support of the Atlantic Area National Authorities against a pre-defined set of selection criteria, as stated in the Programme Manual.
- ✓ The project assessment is done based on the information submitted at the time of application and the selection is made by the Programme Monitoring Committee.
- ✓ **Training will be provided to successful applicants** in relation to effective project implementation throughout the programming period, including Q&A sessions and online tutorials.
